# Coronation of King Charles III – celebration day and wear red, white and blue – NEXT Friday $5^{th}$ May



NEXT Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May we will be having a celebration day in school to mark the Coronation of King Charles III. This is a very special occasion in the UK as there has not been a Coronation since 1952 when Queen Elizabeth was crowned, and so many people will never have seen a coronation take place. A coronation is a key moment in history - when we look back at the history of England and remember the many kings and queens that have reigned such as Henry VIII or Elizabeth I, this is as important a moment in history as those times and will be remembered for many years to come.

A coronation is a special ceremony where a new Monarch (king or queen) is crowned and blessed in front of lots of people. Special prayers are also said for the new monarch and their people during the ceremony, which will take place in Westminster Abbey. It is a very joyful occasion and there will be a big parade through the streets of London, where the new King will greet his people. Lots of special events are taking place around the country and on the television to mark this - you can watch the actual Coronation ceremony on TV on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May. There is also going to be a bank holiday to mark this on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June.



To celebrate this in school, we will be having a Coronation picnic party next Friday. The children will have lunch outside (weather permitting!) in 'street-party' style, with bunting, flags and music. This will have a 'Union Jack' or red, white and blue theme, and so on this day, the children should come to school dressed in red, white and blue. If they have any clothes with the union jack on, they can also wear these, or you may want to dress 'royally' in clothing with crowns on, or wear an actual crown! There will be no charge for this.

The picnic lunch will be a 'British-themed' picnic with a juice carton, a choice of a cheese or jam roll, a choice of pizza, spring roll or cheese and pepper roll, some chips, and a choice of cupcakes or jelly pots, all served in a little 'picnic box'. If your child usually has sandwiches and would like to have a school dinner

for this day, you can come into the office and book a meal for that day. The cost will be £2.50. You should order this by **Wednesday 3rd** May. Any child who usually has dinner in school does not need to pay as they will be given the picnic lunch anyway.

All children will have ice cream cones later on in the playground as a little treat and we have some special commemorative gifts for the children too – one from school and one which has been gifted by our MAC trust. They will receive these on Friday.

If you have booked seats for our seaside trip on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June, a deposit must be paid to secure your seats. Anyone who has not paid a deposit may lose their seats as we have to let the coach company have definite numbers by next Friday.

To help with this, we will provide a free breakfast club for all Y6 children for the duration of the week. Research has shown that a good, healthy breakfast improves brain function and helps children to function better in their lessons! A letter has been sent to Y6 families regarding this earlier in the week.


## This Week's News
