46 Secondary Transfer Applications for September 2023

All children in Year 6 should have received a letter before the holiday with details on how to apply for a secondary school place for September 2023. Online application is now open on the Birmingham City Council website at https://eadmissions.birmingham.gov.uk/prefs.php If you need any assistance with this, please come into school and we will be happy to help.

Secondary Transfer preferences for school places must be submitted to the City council by Monday 31st October 2022. Please ensure that you have applied for places by then, as late applications are less likely to get the school of their choice.

Parents Evening

Our Parents' Evening will take place in school on Wednesday 19th October between 2.30-

5.30pm. Letters went out this week for you to request times for this. Please note that school will close at 2.15pm on this day. All children must be collected at this time by an adult

During the time that you are in your appointment, your child can go into our Creche facility (*only for children who attend our school*) but please only bring children along if they cannot stay at home with another adult.

School Photograph Day - DELAY WITH PICTURES!

As you know the photographer was in school this week to take pictures of the children. Your child should have brought home a proof card with a code for you to scan to access your photos. The photographers have been in touch this morning to let us know that there will unfortunately be a delay in you being able to view your photographs. This is because the files containing the class pictures that were taken have been damaged and they will need to be retaken. **The photographer will be back in school next Thursday morning to retake these** and they should hopefully be available to view by next weekend. In the meantime you can scan your code and register your email address to receive an email to let you know when they are available. PLEASE KEEP YOUR CARDS SAFE! We do not have copies of these and you will be unable to access or view your child's photographs without them.

Fly Vaccination — form deadline

Our flu vaccinations will take place in school on 4th November. You should have received a form regarding this last week. Please return this form even if you do not want your child to be vaccinated. It is important that we hold a completed form for each child.

All forms must be in school ready for collection by Wednesday of next week. We do have spares available in the office if you need one.

confirmation Meeting — NEXT WEDNESDAY

The first parents' meeting for those Catholic children in Y5 and Y6 wishing to be confirmed this school year will take place on **Thursday 13th October** at **3.30pm**. This meeting will take place in the Little Flower Room in school with Father Solomon.

On Sunday 16th October at 9.45am the children and their parents are also asked to attend a Confirmation Commitment Mass at St Joseph's Church, so we can officially start the preparation process. Further meetings will be held throughout the year for parents, so parents can help prepare their children at home to receive these sacraments.

Safer Sleep this Winter — Advice from the Lullaby Trust

The colder months can be a difficult time for families and with the increase in energy bills combined with the cost-of-living crisis, families will naturally be concerned about keeping their homes and their baby warm.

Whilst there may be a temptation to wrap babies up to keep them warm while they sleep, it's a known fact that overheating increases the chances of SIDS and research shows that it's better for babies to be cooler rather than too hot.

To reduce the risk of overheating, avoid using thick bedding and duvets and remove any outdoor clothing and hats when indoors. During the winter months, firmly tucked in sheets and blankets (not above shoulder height) or a well-fitted baby sleep bag are fine for babies to sleep in.
