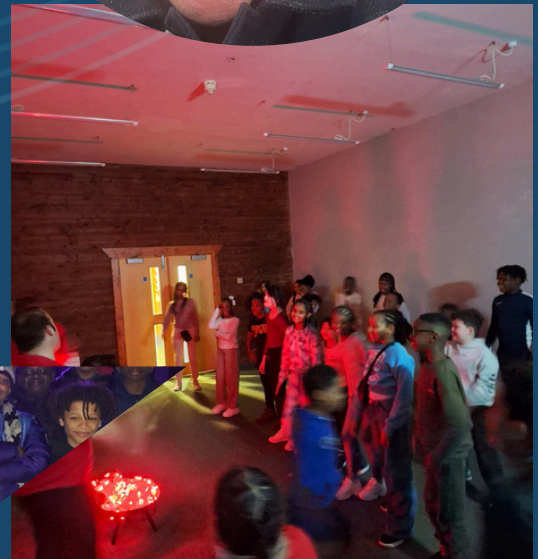

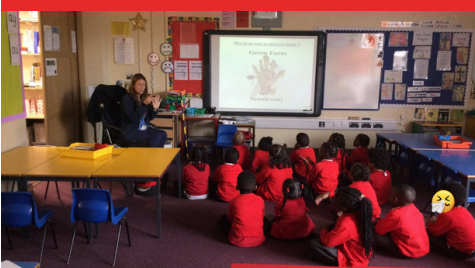
A Healthy Visit: Nurse Ruth at School

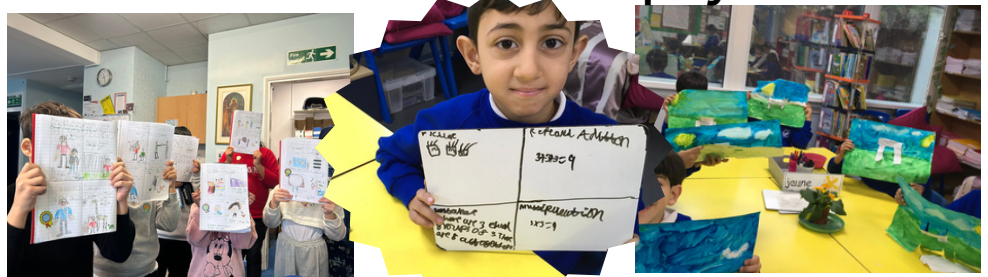

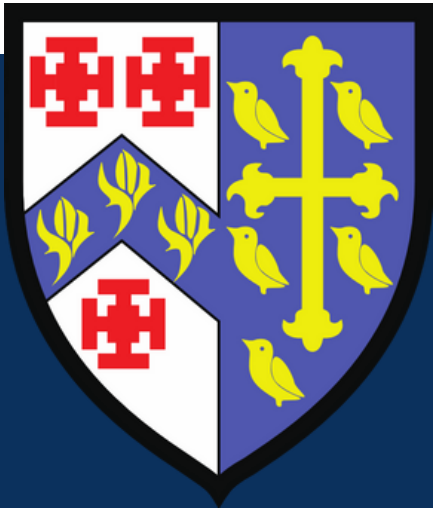
HSBC Inspires Future Leaders

These heartwarming initiatives highlight the power of small acts of kindness and the importance of fostering a sense of community and compassion, especially during the Advent season.



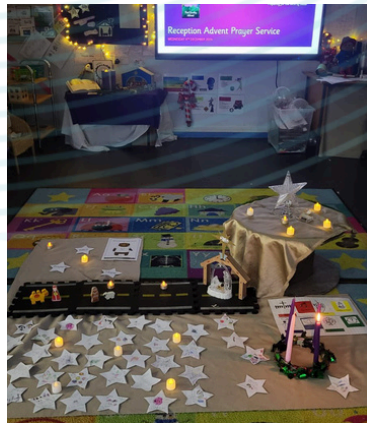
Mini Vinnies Christmas Card Competition Winners
